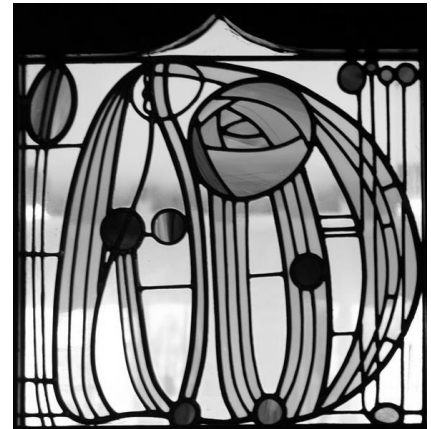


Activity 4 – Bookmark

In the style of Charles Rennie Mackintosh

- Strips of Watercolour paper / white card
- Tracing paper or baking parchment
- Paint / colour pencils / pens
- Black pen / pencil & rubber

This week we are all going to create a bookmark – you could look online for a Mackintosh rose template as a starting point – you could print and then trace it, design your own or



take inspiration from something you are currently reading or listening to. Use watercolour paints, coloured pencils, pens, draw into it using a black pen, if it is waterproof so you should be able to paint over it too but test it first! As ever, these ideas are only a starting place, enjoy yourself! If you have it, cut some nice thick water colour paper into perfect bookmark strips and design and paint on here, paint both sides – they should survive more than one book! Have fun, maybe someone else at home would like to join in and then you could swap bookmarks once you are finished!
